In Harris County, there are a number of elderly tax payers that don't have their "over 65 exemptions" and this is a disgrace. No elderly over 65 should lose his or her property due to delinquent property taxes. There are a number of homeowners who don't have their homestead exemptions. There are many ways that property owners can save on their property taxes.

Taxpayers' Rights, Remedies and Responsibilities

THE BASIC

- Property Taxes Help To Pay For Public Schools, City Streets, County Roads, Police, Fire Protection, and Many Other Services.
- Property taxes are local taxes.
- Your local officials value your property. Set your tax rates and collect your taxes.
- Property taxes are based on the value of the property.

Texas Constitution Sets Five (5) Rules For The Property Taxes

- Taxation must be equal and uniform.
- With some exceptions, all tangible property must be taxed on its current market value. The exceptions include agricultural land and timberland.
- All property is taxable unless a federal or state law provides an exemption for it.
- Property owners have a right to reasonable notice of increase in appraised property value.
- Each property in a county must have one appraised value.

HOW DOES THE SYSTEM WORK?

There are Three (3) parts to the Property Tax System in Texas

- The appraisal district sets the value of your property each year. A chief Appraiser is the chief administrator.
- The appraisal review board (ARB) settles disagreements between the property owner and the appraisal district regarding the value of the property.
- Taxing units decide how much they will spend and determine the total amount of taxes that you pay.

DATES TO REMEMBER

- January 1 marks the beginning of the appraisal
- April 30 Notices are sent
- May 31 File your protest
- October 1 Taxes bills are sent
- January 31 Taxes are due
- February 1 penalty and interest charges begin accumulating on most unpaid tax bills and Tax Collectors may start legal action to collect unpaid taxes
